A Path Appears, from the creative team that brought you the groundbreaking series Half the Sky: Turning Oppression into Opportunity for Women Worldwide, follows intrepid reporters Nicholas Kristof and Sheryl WuDunn and celebrity activists Malin Akerman, Mia Farrow, Ronan Farrow, Jennifer Garner, Ashley Judd, Blake Lively, Eva Longoria, and Alfre Woodard to Chicago, Nashville, Boston, West Virginia, and other parts of the world, as they uncover the harshest forms of gender-based oppression and human rights violations, as well as the effective solutions being implemented to combat them.

The four-hour series will air on PBS as a special presentation of *Independent Lens* on January 26, 2015 as part of the highly regarded Women and Girls Lead initiative. Through heartrending, inspiring storytelling, *A Path Appears* will take viewers on a journey across the country, and across the globe, to drive home the universality of gender inequality and the roots of vulnerability. The series will lead viewers to a deeper understanding of these critical issues and the proven methods of bringing about change. The book, *A Path Appears* by Nicholas Kristof and Sheryl WuDunn, will be released on September 23, 2014.
